


TOOL KIT #3

Take Action





You've been sharing about Basic Income on social media, and talking about it with your friends and family. And now, they want to know what they can do to help make it happen!

Here are some simple actions we can all take to make Basic Income a reality.

1. Write Letters

Our elected officials need to hear from us. They need to know that there is significant voter support for Basic Income, and they need to understand how widespread that support actually is, from voters all across the country.

So, <u>here's</u> how you can find out how to contact your Member of Parliament, and send them a letter that demonstrates your support. Feel free to use our letter template, or customize it to suit your personal circumstances

You can also send written letters to the following Cabinet Ministers. Please note that lettermail to elected officials can be sent free of postage. Simply drop your addressed envelope in any Canada Post mailbox and it will be delivered to your addressed representative (no postage stamp required!):


